## **Big Bubble Recipe - 1 Gallon**

Make a slurry\*:

- 1 Cup Dawn (or CostCo or Joy) Dish Soap
- 1 Tablespoon Baking Powder (not soda)

Add 2 or more of these 3 to make bubbles last:

- 1/4 teaspoon J-Lube powder (more is not better) (try <a href="https://www.valleyvet.com">https://www.valleyvet.com</a>)
- 2 Tablespoons Glycerin (from pharmacy)
- 1 teaspoon Guar Gum.

(Bob's Red Mill brand in some grocery stores)

\*Make a slurry by mixing those ingredients very well to get the lumps out BEFORE adding 15 Cups Water, stir well as you add water.

Best bubble conditions are humid, cloudy days with a slight breeze. Foam is bad, scoop it off.

For my home-made bubble wands, dirt is bad for bubble juice. I clean and dry them after use with cap(s) off.

• When the string (cotton piping) gets tangled just pull the end cap(s) off, untangle & put it back together.

- 1/2 Cup Glycerin (from pharmacy)
- 1 Tablespoon Guar Gum.
